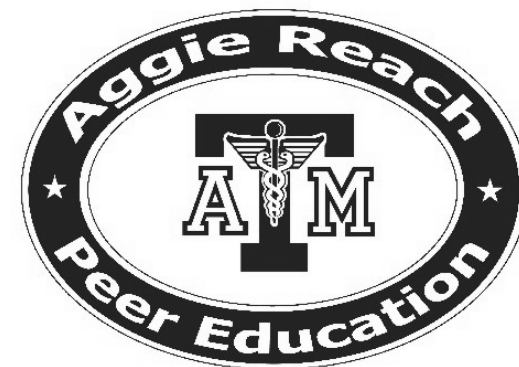
What is Aggie Reach?

Our members play an important role in educating other Aggies by encouraging and advocating for healthy lifestyles, wellness, and disease prevention.

Members present most programs in residence halls, Greek housing, and classes and to student organizations. In our programs, we facilitate audience member involvement in educational games and group discussions.

Applications are accepted year round; however, interviews take place in the spring semester for the fall training class. Training usually takes place in the weeks prior to the fall semester. Training topics include, public speaking, confidentiality, nutrition, sexual health, and general wellness.
